#### **PRINCIPAL'S NEWS**

#### **Swimming Carnival**

Despite a less than ideal weather forecast, our Swimming Carnival last Friday was a great event. Congratulations to Frome, who made it 5 consecutive wins with a 1 point victory over Eyre.



Our Swimming Carnivals are getting bigger and better each year, with this year's carnival the best of the 4 that I have been involved in. The growth in our carnival can be attributed to a variety of factors including:

- The inclusion of additional events into the program allowing primary students to participate, who inject so much energy and excitement into the day
- Attendance rates of secondary students continuing to grow each year
- The increasing level of student participation. This year we had a number of events requiring multiple heats to cater for the number of students who nominated to swim.
- Students who were unable to swim but were involved in the carnival through volunteering for a variety of jobs. These included time keeping, supporting primary students to participate, assisting in the recording of events and working on the BBQ.
- The level of support and encouragement from students for

each other. This was particularly evident in the relay races at the end of the program.

The excellent leadership provided by our House Captains, who organised their teams exceptionally well and supported all students to participate to the best of their ability.

















I would like to commend Ella Thredgold and Jillian Hudson for their work in ensuring the success of the carnival through their excellent organisation prior to and on the day.

Days such as the Swimming Carnival and Sports Day are significant ones on our school calendar and make a major contribution towards strengthening school pride and culture.

Given the restrictions that were in place for much of 2020, it was particularly enjoyable to be able to have parents and the wider community attend the carnival.




