The carnival was a fantastic event, following the successful Swimming Carnival earlier this term. Increased student attendance, growth in the number of students participating in events and exceptional levels of support for fellow students – irrespective of house allegiances – all contributed to a positive atmosphere.

I would like to thank all members of the school community who attended the day, and in particular those who volunteered through supervising an age group or working in the canteen. As I made mention at the end of the carnival, this level of support is greatly appreciated and is another example of the tremendous support we are fortunate to receive from the school and wider community.

Traffic Lights

Traffic Lights form an update for every child in years 7-12. A green light indicates that all work has been submitted and is at or above standard. An orange light indicates that some work is outstanding or that the work isn't confidently at standard – it is the caution colour. A red light indicates that the work submitted is below standard and is often accompanied by work that is not submitted. A red traffic light should prompt immediate action by the student.

The mid-term traffic lights have all been sent home. Please ensure that you have sighted your child's lights, and that you have signed the table to confirm this. Students are encouraged to speak to their teachers to discuss why their colour was orange or red, and to set strategies to improve where they are sitting in relation to the achievement standards. Parents are welcome to communicate with teachers about such strategies as well.
