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PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

I hope everyone had an enjoyable Easter long weekend.

It doesn't seem 10 weeks ago that we started Term 1, and yet we are here with only a couple of days left in the term. End of term reports go home this week, and I encourage students and families to sit down together to discuss the grades and comments provided by their class teachers. More detailed feedback can be sought through parent-teacher interviews early next term; details on how to book these interviews can be found in your child's report.

Looking back across Term 1 there have been a number of highlights that have contributed to a busy but positive term. From an academic perspective, it is very pleasing to see the large number of students who will be awarded Academic Achievement certificates at our end of term assembly on Friday.

The implementation of The Resilience Project has seen students grow their understanding of the key principles of Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness through participating in a wide range of engaging lessons. The activities held on the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence reinforced key messages of the role we can all play in ensuring our school environment is safe and free from bullying. I would like to acknowledge the major role our Student Leaders and House Captains played in organizing a range of activities during the lunchtime picnic on this day.

The enthusiasm in which the students participated in both Swimming Carnival and Sports Day, combined with the support and encouragement they demonstrated for each other, led to these being the best events I have observed in my time at Jamestown. The success of these carnivals flowed on to significantly improved student participation rates at both MNSEC events.

As you may have read in the last edition of our newsletter, students have embraced the Reading Passports, challenging themselves to read books across a variety of genres and authors. It is very pleasing to see students set reading goals for themselves, enabling them to broaden their vocabulary, knowledge and perspectives.




Dear Parents,


