PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

It has been a busy week with students and staff involved in a range of activities.

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are in the process of sitting NAPLAN tests. These tests provide teachers with valuable information regarding the Literacy and Numeracy achievement of students in their classes. This information complements the ongoing assessment and observations teachers make of student learning and is used to plan differentiated learning programs for students.

Parents/caregivers will be provided with their children's results later in the year.

It was fantastic to have a large number of families participate in School Tours on Monday. Our students and staff have great pride in our school, and enjoyed the opportunity to share our facilities, resources and programs with new and existing families. Thank you to the families who attended, as well to Mrs McKay and our Year 9/10 Home Ec class for providing a wonderful morning tea.

Year 10 students are currently in Adelaide on their Careers Trip. This trip, run as part of the Personal Learning Plan (PLP) subject, allows students to gain a better understanding of future career pathways through visiting a range of workplaces, education and training organisations.

Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) Service

Our Governing Council this week agreed to begin the process of establishing an Out of School Hours Care service for the community at Jamestown Community School. An OSHC service may offer care for school-aged children:

- before school and/or after school and/or
- on pupil-free days and/or
- during school holidays.

There are a number of steps in the establishment process, with a survey to determine the need for care in the community being the first of these. Surveys have been sent home with the eldest child in each family this week; to enable us to make an informed decision in establishing the best service to meet families' needs, I ask that you complete and return the survey to Jamestown Community School by Monday 24th May.















Spare surveys can be collected from our Front Office, as well as JCCC and St James.

Should an OSHC service be established at JCS, Governing Council are aiming for a commencement date to coincide with the start of the 2022 school year.
