PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

As you may have read on our Facebook page last week, this year will be my last at Jamestown Community School. Last week I was offered and accepted the position as Principal at John Pirie Secondary School for 5 years, commencing in January 2022.

This wasn't an easy decision to make, given how much I have enjoyed my time at Jamestown and the amazing support we are fortunate to receive from the school community.

The timing of the appointment provides a significant amount of time for a new appointment to be made, and once the successful applicant is appointed, a smooth transition and handover. The process to fill the position will start in the coming weeks and we will advise when an appointment is made.

Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) update

Thank you to all families who returned the OSHC survey. These responses have been collated and have been submitted to our Department. The next step of the process is about to commence with tenders to be called to run the service.

Should all steps of the establishment process run smoothly, we are working towards having an OSHC service for the Jamestown community ready for the start of the 2022 school year. We will continue to keep you updated over the course of the year.

Weeks 8 & 9

The next couple of weeks are going to be quite busy with a range of activities taking place.

Our students and staff are looking forward to our Arts **Evening** next Thursday night (17th June) at 6.30pm. This year the event will be held in our school gym to accommodate an audience while adhering to Covid requirements. Hosting the event in the gym will also allow us to display a large amount of Visual Arts works students have completed in Semester 1.

















Our students have been busily preparing their acts and are looking forward to performing in front of an audience.

A reminder that next Friday (18th June) is a **Student Free Day**. Staff will use this time to work in learning area and year level teams on curriculum development, as well as preparing Semester 2 learning programs ready for the start of the new semester.

As I shared in the previous newsletter, we will be involved in an **External School Review** on Monday 21st and Tuesday 22nd June. All government schools are externally reviewed every 3 years with the focus on evaluating our school's performance. Following the review, we will receive a report with directions for future improvement which will be shared with the school community.

The review will coincide with the **start of Semester 2** on Monday 21^{st} June. While this will not have a significant impact on our Reception – Year 6 students, Year 7 – 11 students will see a change in the elective subjects they study. Year 12 students, who are now more than half way through their academic year, will continue to study their full year subjects.

Exams

As the end of term grows nearer, exams get closer. In years 10-12, all subjects that have an exam in year 12, have exams from year 10 onwards. These content rich and skill-based subjects are enhanced from worthy exam preparation, with exams forming a strong foundation for easier recall in times ahead. Most exams will be set during the student's regular lesson times; however, exam conditions must be adhered to. Students will have their exam schedule on display in their classrooms from Wednesday this week. Absent students will need to sit the exam on their return.


