PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

A 7-day lockdown due to a COVID outbreak wasn't the way we had hoped Term 3 would start. However, I couldn't have been more impressed in the flexibility our students and staff demonstrated in adapting to remote learning, either through learning packs/Class Dojo (Reception - Year 6) or Microsoft Teams (Years 7-12). This enabled students to continue to engage in their learning programs with a minimum of disruption.

I would also like to thank our Year 7-12 students and families for their fantastic cooperation in the wearing of masks upon our return to school. We all have a role to play in keeping ourselves and each other safe, and the willingness of our students to comply with all health advice, including the wearing of masks, has been very heartening to see. We have been provided with plenty of surgical masks should students require them.

Unfortunately due to COVID restrictions we have had to cancel a number of camps and excursions, including the Year 9/10 Ski Trip, SACE Media Studies Excursion and Year 8/9 5-a-side Soccer. Other activities, such as the East of the Ranges Choir performance at the Keith Michell Theatre, have been postponed.

As we have done throughout the COVID pandemic, we will continue to monitor health advice and act accordingly to keep all members of our school community safe. As health advice changes, we will do everything we can to limit disruption to programs and communicate with our school community in a timely manner.

Staffing News

Aimee Goode has accepted the position as Wellbeing Leader at Clare Primary School commencing in 2022. Aimee has made a significant contribution to JCS in her time here, particularly in the role of Wellbeing Leader over the past 18 months. The introduction of The Resilience Project as a whole-school, proactive wellbeing program has been a positive for our school, while her work in supporting a range of young people has been appreciated and highly valued. Aimee was also instrumental in securing the services of a Mental Health Coach who now visits on-site, weekly to meet with students.

We wish Aimee well in her new role; the vacancy behind Aimee is currently being advertised and I will communicate the outcome once it is known.

As the weather has been quite cold lately, please ensure your child's clothing is labelled and they are adhering to the school uniform policy. A copy of the policy can be found in the student diary.




