#### Book Week

Book Week is an event we very much look forward to. Celebrating a love of books perfectly aligns with our improvement priority of growing the reading achievement of all students. Our staff are committed to providing consistent, high quality reading and intervention programs to ensure students develop the Reading skills required to be successful both in their education as well as their post school lives.

However, just as important as ensuring students develop their reading skills is to grow a love of reading in our young people. We want our young people to choose to read, not just because they have to. As teachers and parents we can help to grow this through being readers ourselves; spending 20 minutes a night reading as a family is a valuable investment in your child's future.

#### Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

Ensuring our students have access to technology to fully engage in contemporary learning programs is an ongoing focus for our school. To support this, we have continued our partnership with HP to provide families with the option of purchasing devices at a discounted price to allow our young people to seamlessly transfer their learning from school to home through using the same device.
