PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Thank you to everyone who attended our Presentation Night on Monday evening. Ruby Sutter, Henry Crawford, Sally McKay and Charlie Cooper did a great job hosting the evening which showcased the range of student achievements in 2021.

Well done to all award winners. The quality of nominations continues to grow each year; each award winner and nominee should be exceptionally proud of their efforts in being acknowledged.

Looking ahead, there continues to be much to look forward to for our school:

- We continue to see growth in student achievement across all year levels – improved Running Records, NAPLAN and A-E grades, while our 2020 Stage 2 results were the best on record
- Next year sees a further expansion of our Agriculture program, resulting in Year 7 and 8 students being able to study the subject for the first time
- Our ICT facility, Room 29, will be redeveloped during the Christmas holidays. This will provide students and staff with greater access to a range of ICT resources, including our 3D printers
- We welcome 21 Reception students in 2022, the largest intake of Reception students for many years





- Next year also sees the establishment of an on-site Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) facility, an important service not only for our school community, but for all families across the Jamestown area.
- Thank you again to Northern Areas Council for their support towards the establishment costs of the service.

The end of the year also sees a time to farewell staff who won't be returning to JCS in 2022:



- Aimee Goode takes up a role as Wellbeing Leader at Clare Primary School. Aimee has provided high level wellbeing support to students and staff over the last 2 years.
 Aimee was also responsible for the successful introduction of The Resilience Project as our whole
 - school proactive wellbeing program.
- Jaime Werner has accepted a teaching position at Salisbury East High School in 2022. Jaime has
 revamped our Visual and Creative Arts program over the last 2 years with much success, as evidenced
 by the excellent Art Exhibition staged at the Art Gallery in recent weeks.
- Catharine Schulz moves to Laura Primary School in 2022. Catharine has been the first port of call for students, staff and members of the school and wider community for many years, providing outstanding service to all members of the school community.
- Erin Booth has resigned from her role as Pastoral Care Worker for personal reasons. Erin has been a highly valued member of our staff, supporting many students in recent years, and will be greatly missed by students and staff.

On behalf of our school community, I thank Aimee, Jaime, Erin and Catharine for their service to our school, and wish them well in their future endeavors.
