PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

FINALLY we have all our students back on site - just the way we like it. Over the 8 days of hybrid learning, it would be fair to say that it was tough for some, okay for others, like normal for the year levels allowed on site, fortunate for the new students and interesting for the teachers to say the least. Whilst it wasn't what we had envisioned coming into 2022, it is what it is.

I would like to say a **HUGE THANKYOU** to all of the students, families and staff for getting on with the job at hand and doing their best in an unusual situation. It was certainly appreciated by many in the way families communicated with us as needed, and vice versa.

Covid reminders

We have now commenced all year levels in face to face learning, making the school that bit busier and certainly louder. However, we still have Covid-19 protocols that are <u>mandated</u> and need to be followed by staff, students, and visitors. A reminder that:

- ✓ MASKS are to be worn by ALL students in years 7-12 when indoors
- \checkmark MASKS to be work by ALL staff when indoors and/or working closely with students outdoors
- ✓ MASKS to be worn by ALL parents/visitors
- ✓ Parents to NOT enter classrooms unless permitted by the class teacher
- ✓ Regular handwashing and use of hand sanitiser by staff and students
 - ✓ NO sharing of water bottles or food
 - ✓ Limited intermingling amongst staff

It is important to remember that we do have 4 year olds and 5-11 year olds not yet vaccinated or eligible for a Covid-19 vaccination on site. These students are extremely vulnerable, so everyone must abide by these mandates, unless an exemption has been sighted for not wearing a mask. Thank you to those who are doing the right thing.

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


Reading information

In our Reception class this year, we have many new families to our school, but many other established families, may not know much about The Science of Reading. TSoR is all about how we learn to read – an incredibly vital life skill for us all. We know that we have 26 letters of the alphabet, made up of vowels and consonants, but, those letters actually make sounds. These are called a phoneme. There are 44 phonemes we learn to help us read, spell and write. There is a specific order to which we introduce letters and their sounds, so that our students can quickly become readers, not memorizers. The first 6 letters our receptions will learn are

S A T P I N

Once they have mastered those letters, they can make words eg sat, pin, mat, tin, tap, nip, nap, pat, sin, sap, nit, pit. – words they can read !! We can tell through them sounding out the letters that they are actually reading, not just guessing. As they learn the next 6 sounds, their vocabulary increases and so on.




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To better support their learning to read, they will also use a decodable reader which will include many of the words that are made up of the letters they have learnt, so again, we can ensure they are reading the words, not guessing.

Here at JCS, we follow the Michael Heggerty books to support our JP students with their phonemic awareness and use the synthetic Jolly Phonics program to introduce sounds and grammar to our R-2 students. Both of these programs are endorsed by the Department for Education SA. I have included an infographic to help demonstrate some of this information further.

Middle & Senior School Diaries



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LIBRARY NEWS

Welcome back to the start of the year. I've had a few questions about how the library works so hopefully this answers some questions. Classes in R-6 have all booked into the library for a lesson a week. Your class teacher will let you know your class time. Students are able to borrow books during this time (if they would like to borrow a DVD they can do this during recess, lunch or after school). The library holds the library cards for students in Reception to 7, making it easier for borrowing. Year 8s have been given their cards this year, although there are still some students who need to pick their card up and are invited to drop into the library to do this. Students are able to borrow books for 4 weeks and DVDs for 2 weeks. Each week, homegroup teachers are given a list of overdue books (this is normally on a Thursday). If you've lost a book, don't panic! We are sure it will turn up, however, if it doesn't there is a fee attached to lost books. If you pay for a book and then it is found, we will happily refund your money. If you have any questions at all, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Some more information:

- The library runs the <u>Premier's Reading Challenge</u>. This is a literacy engagement program that was introduced by the Premier in 2004 to encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading, improve literacy levels. The Challenge requires students to read 12 books between the beginning of the school year and early September
- JCS has also created a <u>Reading Passport</u> where students from year 3-7 participate by reading particular books that earn them stickers. More information will be provided about this in future newsletters.
- <u>Advance notice</u>: Jamestown School Community Library hosts two <u>Book Fairs</u> a year. Students are able to come to the library during recess, lunch and after school to purchase books, stationery and posters. This is a fantastic school library fundraiser. The first Book Fair will be held from Tuesday 15 March until Thursday 17 March. Again, more information will be provided in future newsletters.


