Monique Marlow – Bachelor of Creative Industries – Film & TV @ Flinders University


Alicia McDonald gained a traineeship @ Goyder's Line Medical Practice

Year 10 Introduction to SACE Information Night

This was held on Tuesday night – where we had a positive turn out and discussed some key features of year ten, including our SACE, PLP, Work Experience, Careers Trip and the submission policy.

The key messages included:

- **PLP** is the first, compulsory subject that goes towards your SACE completion. If a 'C' grade isn't achieved, then you will need to repeat the subject next year.
- **Submission Policy.** In year 10, there is additional importance placed on students submitting work on time. Due dates are set by teachers with ample warning of draft and assignment timelines. Extensions can be sought, however their approval relies on students using lesson time to be productive, and asking PRIOR to the due date **by email.** Remember that without a timely submission, students will be withdrawn from their electives until the compulsory work is completed.
- Work Experience. Start the discussion with parents and teachers of where you might like to go. Keep your PLP discussions in mind and consider the types of locations where your strengths will be of most use.
- Careers Trip Is early next term. Students will need a student ID card for the trip.

As we hit week 5, we are almost half way through term one. Hopefully our weeks are beginning to feel more 'normal'. If you would like to discuss anything further, please don't hesitate to email me Danya.McKay149@schools.sa.edu.au

SPORTS DAY 2022

Sports day will be here before we know it!! Friday the 11th of March (week 6) we will hold our annual R-12 Sports day. This year the day will look slightly different in an effort to continue to improve this event.

The main change is the R-5 students will start their day at 9:45am for a 10am start. Students can be dropped at school at 9:45am or normal school time (8:50am) activities will be run for those students until the start of Sports Day events. Buses will run as normal that day.

The 6-12 students need to report to their homegroup teacher at 8:45am ready for the day to start promptly at 9am. A program will come home this week with the eldest in the family. The program will include R-5 and 6-12 events.

A reminder to students and parents that R-5 students move through their events in their year levels with a year level supervisor. All students 6-12 students move around to all Track and Field events with their age group supervisors, all students are expected to participate in all Track and Field events including the 100m and 200m sprints. The 1500m, 800m and 400m events are all nominated and the 3 best High Jumpers from each house/ age group participate in this event on the day, this is due to the time-consuming nature of the event. The 1500m and 800m events will be run in the lead up to sports day, the 1500m will be run this Thursday the 3rd of March from 9am and the 800m events will be run Monday next week the 7th of March from 9am weather permitting.

As always, we are looking for helpers again this year. If you are able to volunteer your time in the canteen, helping on an event or as an age group supervisor (age group supervisor involves being in charge of an group of students and ensuring they get to events on time). I would be greatly appreciated.
