# PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

#### **SCHOOL CANTEEN**

Julie Kelly does an amazing job coordinating our school canteen, and our students are incredibly lucky to have access to such a diverse range of food and drink, 3 times a week. Her Friday pizzas are a huge hit with both staff and students, and her other lunch time specials are also extremely popular. With the online ordering system, there has been an increase in orders, especially on Fridays, where it is not uncommon for there to be 40+ lunches ordered across the school, with one Friday having 51 orders. This does not include all of the walk in food and drink being provided, such as homemade pizzas and cakes/slices to our students and staff. Please remember that we have the Flexischools App to order lunches — this needs to be done by 9:30am

All of Julies work doesn't come easy, and she would **GREATLY APPRECIATE** some volunteer helpers.

If you can spare anytime on a Friday, between the hours of 9:30am – 1:30pm, we would all be extremely grateful.
