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SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Department for Education has the aspirational goal of every student achieving 95% attendance for each school year. Here at Jamestown Community School, we work hard to support our students to ensure that they are excited and keen to attend each day to maintain their connections to school, staff and fellow students. We also know that there can be bumps along the way that can impede a student's attendance. These can vary from illness, family reasons and / or medical reasons, through to bigger and more concerning issues and in some cases, blatant refusal. The key to working through such challenges, is the families and school working and communicating together. As a site we have processes we must follow, but we also have the scope to work in ways suited to each individual scenario. If your child suddenly refuses to attend or mentions that they don't want to go to school when there has been no previous issues, please contact us so we can work together to have them return. We are required to follow up unexplained absences by law, hence the messages and phone calls asking where your child was on given dates. Like I have mentioned, the key is in communication. Please contact us should you have trouble having your child attend, together we can work through to a solution.

The school chooks have been very busy & we have lots of eggs, freshly collected most days \$3.00 a dozen available from the front office.


