PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

From Miss Kelly

A couple of weeks ago, 3 reception boys appeared in my office requesting a meeting. I gladly sat down and listened to them as they spoke to me about how they wanted some new equipment for the Junior Primary play area – specifically:

4 shovels with metal handles

1 bridge

2 fake crocodiles

Last week I typed up a letter, as the boys spoke to me, that we sent off to the local hardware stores asking if they had any shovels in stock that we could purchase and if they knew where we might find a bridge and 2 fake crocodiles...Today we, received a response from Rynnes, so the boys and I proceeded to head off to visit the store to check out what they had. The boys were very excited, as you can imagine, and were extremely pleased to be able to purchase 2 new metal shovels. The boys had such a fabulous learning experience and couldn't wait to get back to class to share what had happened with their classmates and teacher.

After the recent Adelaide show, I had a visit from 2 boys at the opposite end of the school asking for a meeting to discuss an observation they had seen whilst presenting cattle. The boys had noticed that some of the better-dressed sites had matching caps instead of Akubras. We all know how nice an Akubra can look, but this year we had different shades of brown and the students noticed that this may have had a small impact on the judging. The two-year 11 students spoke to me in our meeting about why they believe having caps would be more beneficial for students here at Jamestown Community School when presenting at the show and other reasons for Ag students. Their argument in favour was very clear, organised, and made such a good argument, I allowed them to design a possible cap from which they are now awaiting a quote for costs.

Both of these experiences, whilst different, have allowed students here at Jamestown Community School to have a positive say in school improvements and has allowed the students to be involved with either all of or part of a process. This has provided our students with an authentic learning experience in so many ways that excite them, provides a great example of student agency, and further builds trust between both staff and students, demonstrating the positive relationships we value here at Jamestown Community School. I hope that there will be many more experiences such as these over the upcoming terms and years.

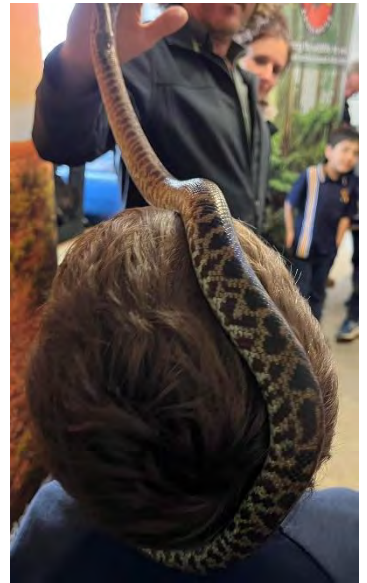


EXCURSIONS
