


2023 School Improvement Plan Summary

To increase the number of students achieving SEA in Reading.	<p>2022: Goals were aligned to Writing achievement 80% of years 3, 5, 7 and 9 achieve SEA in NAPLAN Writing.</p> <p>2023: 75% (12/16 students) will score 50+ out of 60 on the End of Year Australian Heggerty screen for Receptions. 75% (17/22) students in year 1 will achieve SEA in Year 1 Phonics Screen Check. 75% (14/18) students will record green in the End of Year DIBELS Nonsense Word Fluency (NWF) screen. 75% (14/18) of year 3 students will achieve SEA in NAPLAN Reading. 67% (12/18) of year 5 students will achieve SEA in NAPLAN Reading and we will increase those in High Bands from 5 to 6 (33%). 65% (16/25) of year 7 students will achieve SEA in NAPLAN Reading whilst increasing those in High Bands from 1 to 3 (12%). 80% (16/20) of year 9 students will achieve SEA in NAPLAN Reading whilst increasing those in High Bands from 6 to 8 (40%). 100% of stage 1 English students will achieve a "C" grade or above.</p> <p>2024: 75 % year 9 students will achieve SEA in NAPLAN Reading. 100% of stage 1 English students will achieve a "C" grade or above.</p>	<p>Primary: If we explicitly teach Phonological Knowledge, Phonemic Awareness, a synthetic, structured Phonics program, Fluency and Vocabulary in our daily literacy blocks, we will see an increase in students Reading achievement year R-6.</p> <p>Secondary: If we explicitly teach fluency in years 7 and 8 English, as well as explicitly teach vocabulary through identifying Tier1, 2 and 3 subject specific vocabulary in years 7 -10 ,we will increase students Reading achievement in years 7-10, as well as their writing achievement.</p>	<p>We will see students engaged in their Reading through formative assessment and increased student capacity. When we explicitly have students practice fluency 3x week, we will hear increased fluency in students Reading. We will see students learning the same content but in different ways when observed by teachers. We will see and/or hear students increased use of Tier 2 and 3 vocabulary in their writing and/or oral presentations.</p>
To increase the number of students achieving SEA in Numeracy.	<p>2022: 17% of year 7 (4/18) and year 9 (4/21) students will achieve High Bands in Numeracy.</p> <p>2023: 67% (12/18) year 3 students achieve SEA in NAPLAN Numeracy. 67% (14/17) year 5 students achieve SEA in NAPLAN Numeracy and we increase those in HB from 2 to 4 students (22%). 80% of year 7 students (8/10 year 6's from JCS in 2022) achieve SEA in NAPLAN Numeracy. 50% (10/20) of our year 8 students will achieve an A/B grade in Maths. 80% (16/20) of year 9 students achieve SEA in NAPLAN Numeracy whilst increasing those in High bands from 3 to 5 (25%). 53% (9/17) of our year 10 students will achieve an A/B grade in Maths. 100% students in Stage 1 Maths, achieving a minimum "C" grade, and 53% (9/17) achieve an A/B grade.</p> <p>2024: 80% of students achieve SEA in NAPLAN Numeracy in years 3 and 5. 25% of year 7 and 9 students achieve High Bands in NAPLAN Numeracy</p>	<p>If we increase teachers knowledge and understanding of the maths curriculum, and their capacity to plan for intellectual stretch, we will see an increased number of students achieving SEA and High Bands in Numeracy.</p>	<p>We will see students learning the same content but in different ways when observed by teachers. We will see students engaged in their maths learning through formative assessment. We will see an increase in A/B grades in our year 7-10 grade collection.</p>
